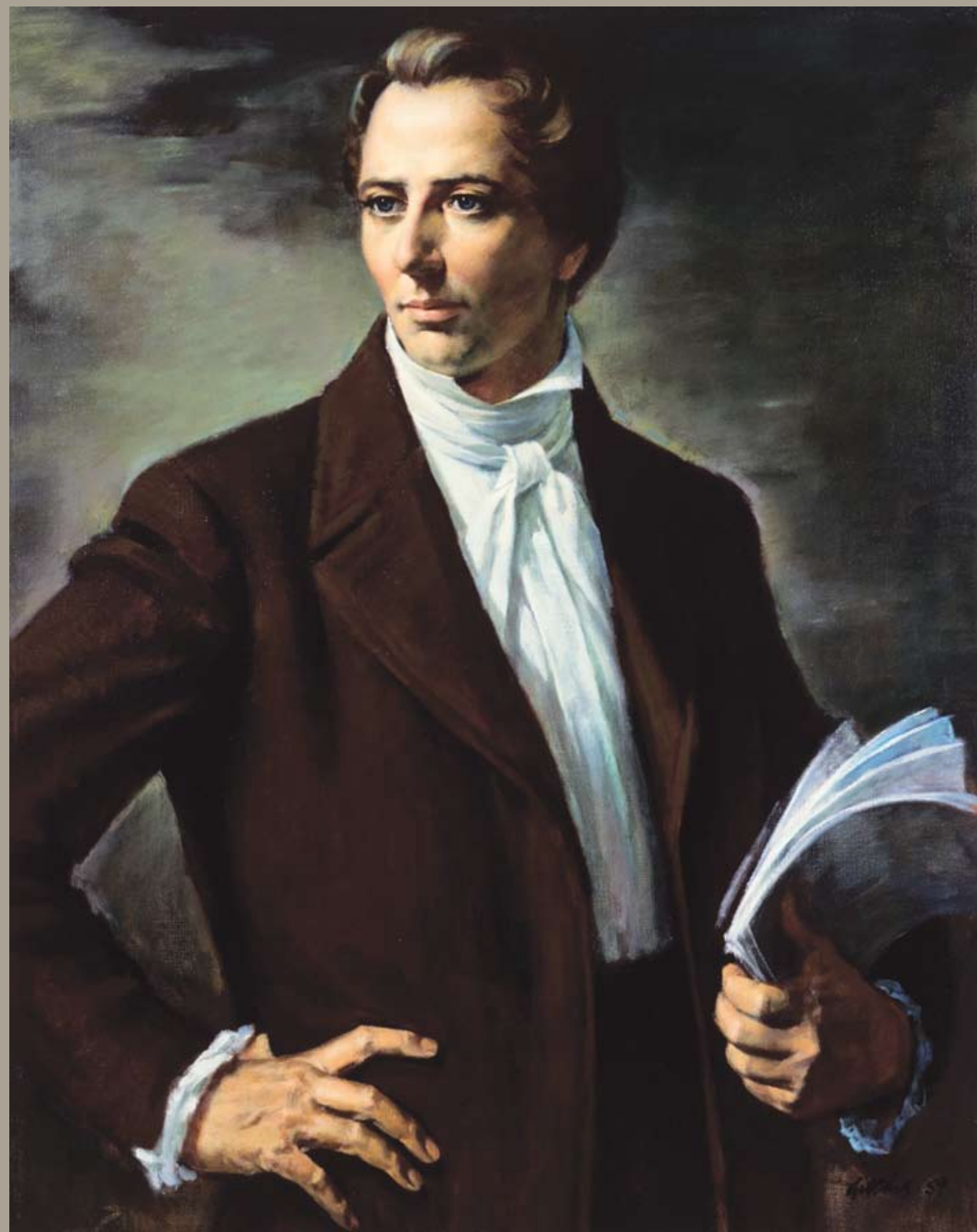

Gouverneur Morris Professor of History, emeritus, Columbia University



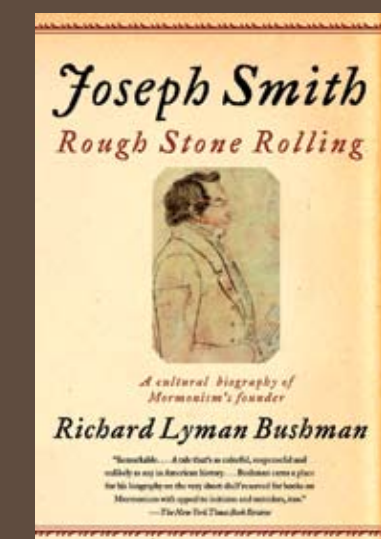
Richard Lyman Bushman is Gouverneur Morris Professor of History, emeritus, at Columbia University. His recent book, *Joseph Smith: Rough Stone Rolling*, has been called "the best book ever written about Mormonism's founding father, and America's greatest homegrown prophet." Bushman's first book, *From Puritan to Yankee: Character and the Social Order in Connecticut, 1690–1765* won the Bancroft Prize in 1968. He taught at Brigham Young University, Boston University, and the University of Delaware before moving to Columbia. He and his wife Claudia live in New York City.
